Directors Corner Tim Redmond – Golf

With summer coming to a close, soon many snowbirds will be returning to Maple Leaf. I am personally looking forward to another great season that we are all about to embark on.

Golf Overview:

Between 1986 and 2005, there was a 44% increase in the number of golf courses nationally. Beginning in 2006, participation in golf started declining. The National Golf Foundation lists the Great Recession and oversupply of courses as two primary factors in that decline. Since 2006, 8% of golf courses nationwide have closed. In recent years,

golf participation rates have stabilized and last year found a modest increase in golf participation for the first time in 14 years. Senior citizens participation rates increased even faster.

Over the past 15 years, Maple Leaf experienced the same phenomenon in golf participation. I believe we are experiencing a resurgence in golf at Maple Leaf too. During the 2018-2019 season, rounds played and membership levels both increased. Further, when Allegiant Airlines' Sunseeker Resort opens next year, locals who golf at Kingsway may find difficulty securing tee times there. We must attract our share of those displaced golfers to Maple Leaf. While this past season's numbers were very good, I expect the coming season to be even better.

Course Maintenance:

As of mid-August, year to date rainfall totals in Port Charlotte were 40.18 inches. That is more than 10 inches above average. The excessive rainfall has made mowing and aerifications very challenging. Likewise, mowing in the park has been particularly difficult. Chris Spence and his staff are working hard to mitigate problems associated with mowing in extremely wet conditions, but it is especially difficult. Waiting to mow in dryer conditions creates other problems.

Chris' crew is addressing the mounds on several green collars. His crew is top-dressing the collars weekly to even the terrain. We should see improvements this year. As the green collars are leveled over time, more aggressive aerification and rolling should diminish the mounds. Some things just take time.

Pro Shop:

Membership applications are now being accepted for the 2019-2020 season. Applications were enclosed in the July mailing and can also be found on our website clicking on the menu item Our Community and then select the Golf Membership Application item. Members paying via cash or check will again receive a 1.5% discount on membership fees.

After a one-year hiatus, crossovers were again utilized in the 2018 – 2019 peak season. When crossovers are employed, players are sent to holes 1 and 10 for each tee time until the course is full. At Maple Leaf, this usually takes about 1½ hours. Once the course is full, tee times are discontinued for the next 1½ hours. If desired, crossovers can be utilized a second or third time on extremely busy days. Crossovers provide more members an opportunity to golf when demand is brisk. Think about it, 40 additional golfers get to play on the back nine during the first 1½ hours the course is open that otherwise may not play. Monday, Friday and Saturday crossovers will again be employed in the upcoming season.

Maple Leaf Golf Association:

The Maple Leaf Golf Association (GA) is comprised of a group of elected volunteers who, as one of their objectives, plan and administer a wide range of golf activities. Among those activities are three golf leagues, tournaments, golf events, clinics and social gatherings.

During the season the GA oversees our three leagues at Maple Leaf: The Ladies League on Tuesday mornings, the Men's League on Wednesday mornings and the Mixed League on Thursday mornings. All leagues provide fun for their participants and are seeking golfers of any skill level.

Among the tournaments are the ever-popular Member-Member; the Club Championship and the season finale - The Spring Fling.

A couple of new programs are, Taste of Golf, aimed at teaching golf basics, rules and etiquette and Nine and Dine, a 9-hole scramble with dinner to follow in the Country Club.

Presidents Corner Rick Hull

On Wednesday, August 14th the BOD interviewed three candidates for General Manager to replace John Laliberte who has resigned. The candidates' names were Rolf Eckert, Joseph Meyers and Mitchell Krach. At the end of the interview process the BOD offered the position to Mitchell Krach who accepted with great enthusiasm. The BOD and Mitchell have come to an agreement on a three-year contract and he will start his career here in Maple Leaf on Monday, August 26, 2019. He will be transitioning with John Laliberte until the 30th when John departs and will then become our new General Manager. Mitchell will be coming to Maple Leaf from Crystal Lakes, a community like ours that has about sixteen

hundred homes, 2 golf courses and other amenities. He also has a strong background in food and beverage which will be very helpful in selecting our new food and beverage manager which will be starting shortly.

Please join me in welcoming Mitchell to Maple Leaf. He is excited to begin and is looking forward to meeting some of our residents when we hold our September Coffee Hour and of course meeting our snowbirds when they return for another wonderful season.

Many questions are being asked about the new fiberoptic internet/phone system. The contract with Century Link has been signed and approved by the Corporation Attorney. Century Link has been working on the design stages for several weeks and the project will be laid out in two stages to cover all 285 acres of the park including all of the public buildings that will have fiberoptic feeds. For example, the Country Club/Sandbar, CanAm, Fitness Center and Sales Office etc.

Century Link will be in the park sometime in September to review their plans including a timetable and the direction in which they plan to start. The actual construction will more than likely start the first part of October. The entire project is expected to take three to four months to complete.

Once the process starts, we will have Century Link come in and explain once again how the system will be managed. The cost per household will be \$30.95 a month for Wi-Fi service. If you want phone service, it can be included for the \$30.95 a month at no extra cost for the first three years. The phone is optional, you do not have to sign up for it. If you do want a phone, it is likely they will be changing the phone number. We will be having future informational meetings scheduled once we get closer to the start of the project.

On a different note, road work on Maple Lane and Mohawk Trail (phase 1) has been scheduled to start on September 2nd and (phase 2) Kings Court and Muskoka will follow. There is also a patch in the road on the Queensway between the two ponds and some repairs to be done between Maintenance road and Nipigon. This work is expected to take 4 to 5 weeks.

A major project remaining is the CanAm outside deck. This project is still in the engineering and design phase before sending out for bid. It would be prudent for the organizers of Party in the Park to work with the Main Office to come up with alternative plans as the deck will not be available. Most likely the Wednesday and Sunday weights program will be held inside the CanAm building for the entire winter season. It is our hope to have the deck ready by March for Mardi Gras, but we must be prepared to make alternate plans for this event.

The Country Club spruce up project is almost completed. Wade and our Maintenance staff have done a wonderful job. I think when you see it you will agree. The Maintenance crew have also begun the job of landscaping at the Charlotte Post Office.

It will not be long before our "snowbirds" return for another season of "fun in the sun". I hope everyone has had a wonderful summer and ready for another great season in Maple Leaf. Safe travels.....see you soon!



Message from The Treasurer *Karen Hamilton*

I hope everyone has been enjoying their summer and have had lots of fun times with family and friends.

I hope all of you have had the time to look at the pictures posted on our web site of the many changes in the Country Club. As you know, it has been a long process, but so worth it! I hope everyone will find the new look as beautiful as I do.

What began as a small facelift became a complete renovation as we kept uncovering problems within the structure. Fortunately, we had some contingency funds built into the capital budget for the year and were able to cover the costs for the much needed

renovations and upgrades to the CC kitchen. Wade and his crew have saved us thousands of dollars and should be commended for the quality of workmanship they have brought to this renovation.

If you will recall, we residents approved using income from 2018 to help fund the capital budget for 2019. The capital budget total for 2019 was approved for \$941,684.00. In work scheduled for this year, the capital budget includes \$83,000 for the Woodworkers and post office renovation, \$240,000 for road repairs. We have more capital expenses to come for this year, but I do anticipate we will stay within the total budgeted amount for this 2019.

It will be a challenge again in 2020 to fund all necessary capital expenses. As you know the Sundeck has to be replaced. As of this date, we do not have an estimate of the replacement cost. We do know the bidding will fall into the last quarter of this year.

We have just begun the budgeting process and will be reporting future financial plans to the homeowners later in the year. Our park is showing its' age and we will likely continue to have some unexpected projects that will need our attention. Fortunately, we are very sound financially and have put many projects requiring funds behind us.

I look forward to seeing you in the coming months and wish all safe travels as you return.

In the CamAm center Rick Crum entertained us on Monday nights with karaoke throughout the summer.


Harry Vinci organized monthly musical evenings with music videos, karaoke and dancing also in the CanAm center.



On Sunday November 17, Maple Leaf will host a Jimmy Fund golf tournament for the first time initiated by Pat Palmer, a new resident of Maple Leaf and a golf enthusiast. Pat and his family have held a Jimmy Fund golf tournament in Massachusetts since 2012 which supports the Angela and Patrick Palmer Foundation, part of the Jimmy Fund, and Pat hopes to continue what had become an annual tradition there here in Florida.

In 2011, Pat's wife Angela was diagnosed with primary brain cancer and treated at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute in Massachusetts. In an effort to improve the quality of her life, Angela agreed to trial an experimental drug paid for by the Jimmy Fund that significantly prolonged Angela's life for 4 years beyond her initial diagnosis. Pat feels strongly about giving back so together they established The Angela and Patrick Palmer Foundation, part of the Jimmy Fund, to raise funds for cancer research and to eliminate the cost to patients and their families for human trial implementation of experimental therapies. He hopes to continue supporting through his Foundation the Jimmy Fund here at Maple Leaf. At this time there are approximately 4-5 Jimmy Fund golf tournaments held each year in Florida.
