As of this writing, the season is coming to a close. Thank you to all of our snowbirds who have supported our events and amenities to keep our community the best of the best.


The finance committee has worked diligently over the past year to create our Expanded Emergency Fund for the wind damage in the event we have another Cat 4-5 hurricane we should be financially stable for clean-up and repairs. Although we have a strong plan, we are hoping for no hurricanes for a few years. Hurricane lan was a large burden on our community and several residents are still trying to get repairs done and/or completed. Maple Leaf has been blessed that we have only a few issues still to be completed and have contractor's contracted to get the work done.

The finances for March have been posted on the website, you may notice a new form called the Forecast. This form was created by the finance committee to make it a bit easier to see the budget for the month and the actual revenue/expenses for each month. This form will also assist in the planning for the year due to actual vs budget items and to help identify the months we are slow and revenues are down.

The finance committee has also developed the new 10yr plan which will be discussed and announced at the June 17, 2024 open board meeting which will be by ZOOM for all to see. Also, the golf rates will be announced at that time. The committee has worked this plan closely with all of our revenue areas of the community and we feel this is a great opportunity to move our community forward and to keep our capital budget on track for the future. All of our managers have worked diligently to increase revenues and to keep expenses down, and with the month ending in March, this has been a great season and I would like to thank all of our managers for a great job this season.

Season in our Maple Leaf community has been closer to a regular season, as we adjusted to the "new normal" in a post Ian and Idalia world. We will continue to provide updates via email blast on Fridays. If you have not been receiving the emails, please send an email to <u>info@mapleleafgcc.net</u> and we will put you on the list.

A brief update of some subjects follows:

SUMMER PROJECTS.

We will be working on many projects over the Summer months. The Woodworker's shop, rest room building, and general re-configuration of the Maintenance area.

Drainage work will also be done during the off season, with the relining of many of our deteriorating storm drainpipes and rebuilding of drainage structures. Repair to

those areas damaged by hurricane Ian will continue to move forward. Resurfacing of the tennis courts, shades for shuffleboard & bocce, and perimeter fence repairs are just a few of the projects we are currently working on.

HURRICANE SEASON.

This August 13th will be the 19th anniversary of Hurricane Charley. It destroyed over 450 homes and damaged almost all the others in Maple Leaf. September 2022's arrival of Ian is still fresh in all our minds, as we continue to repair/replace areas effected by the storm. We must always be prepared. Have you secured all loose objects on your lot? Do you have provisions if we lose power for a number of days? Do you have a plan to evacuate the Park? HAVE A PLAN; BE PREPARED. DON'T BE COMPLACENT AND THINK IT WILL NOT HAPPEN AGAIN!

LOT CARE.

The much hotter weather, humidity, and frequent rains are just over the horizon. The spring and summer months produce a growth rate five times the winter rate. Grass and weeds can grow six inches a week. The Corporation only mows and trims lots; we do not maintain gardens, planters, shrubs, etc. Homeowners are responsible to ensure that your lot is maintained in your absence. Violations will be reported to the homeowner, not those who have been designated to care for the lot.

Just a reminder, catch & release is always in effect and please do not use live bait, or nets.

COMMUNICATIONS AND TECHNOLOGY – Kay Cosgray

Hope everyone has a good summer, just an update on our safety procedures this committee has prepared and approved by the board. The request for cameras for security has been planned in a 2-phase process, but with the diligent help of Dave Zakikian and the staff of Maple Leaf both phases have been completed.

Cameras have been installed in the Fitness Center, and outside the fitness center to view the pool area and the tennis courts, cameras in the CanAm post offices, along with internet service in the woodworker's shop in order for the club to install cameras. The front gate has 4 cameras, incoming and outgoing vehicles, bicycle and pedestrian traffic, along with the back gate, there are 2 cameras for incoming and outgoing vehicles and pedestrians. Also, the Charlotte post office and the Charlotte center to view the tennis courts, lawn bowling, maintenance gate and swimming pool.

All cameras will be able to be viewed by security and the front gate along with management. If you see something please say something, we are committed to safety and we have the capability to review specific dates and times for a length of time on the cameras.

The board and the committee have worked hard to bring a sense of security to our community, and with the addition of the security cameras we feel this will be accomplished.

GOLF COURSE

The Superintendent Revenge tournament was an enormous success, I want to thank Nathan and his staff, along with everyone who participated, as well as all the good comments about the tournament. My team and I had a lot of fun setting up and already thinking about next year and more creative ideas.

Our first Wednesday closer will be on May 15th and continue every Wednesday until the end of September. We will be doing a mole cricket application on May 25th. The first full week closure will be the week of June 3rd through the 9th. We have a few projects we will be doing this summer, like

sodding some of the bunker faces and bare areas on the golf course, along with some drainage work. **<u>GROUNDS</u>**

I have met with the NRC committee and have mapped out areas where new trees will be planted throughout the park in the green spaces to replace some that were destroyed by Irma. 21 trees will be planted depending on funds.

The annual ant application was done throughout the park the first week of April. Trimming of the palm trees will begin in July, hedge trimming along fence line will be done three times this year, but we are still waiting for dates.

The mowing crew will be mowing the weeks of May 6th and 20th, then they will begin weekly mows in June. We will be doing some sod work in the park, covering up some of the areas where trees have been taken down and where debris was piled on certain areas throughout the park.

Again, if there are any Irrigation issues, please contact the office so a work order can be made, and you will be added to the list.

I hope everyone has a great summer and we'll see you next year.
